## PSALM 146:9

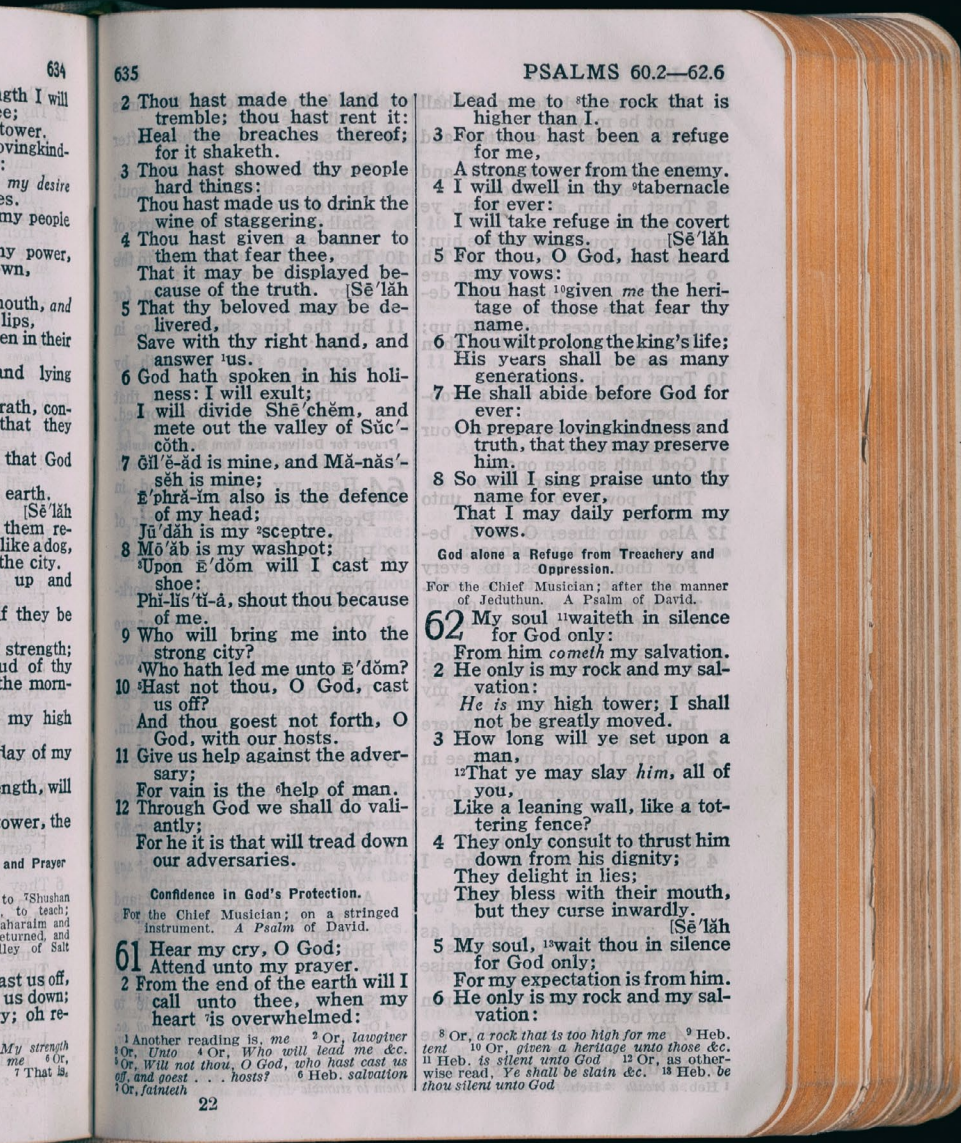
"The Lord watches over the foreigner and sustains the fatherless and the widow, but he frustrates the ways of the wicked."

### PSALMS 60.2—62.6

2 Thou hast made the land to tremble; thou hast rent it: Heal the breaches thereof; for it shaketh.  
3 Thou hast showed thy people hard things: Thou hast made us to drink the wine of staggering.  
4 Thou hast given a banner to them that fear thee. That it may be displayed because of the truth. [Sē'lāh]  
5 That thy beloved may be delivered, Save with thy right hand, and answer us.  
6 God hath spoken in his holiness: I will exult; I will divide Shē'chem, and mete out the valley of Sūc'cōth.  
7 Āl'ē-ād is mine, and Mā-nās'sēh is mine; Ē'phrā'im also is the defence of my head; Jū'dāh is my sceptre.

6 Thou wilt prolong the king's life; His years shall be as many generations.  
7 He shall abide before God for ever: Oh prepare lovingkindness and truth, that they may preserve him.  
8 So will I sing praise unto thy name for ever, That I may daily perform my vows.

God alone a Refuge from Treachery and Oppression.  
For the Chief Musician; after the manner of Jeduthun. A Psalm of David.

62 My soul waiteth in silence for God only: From him cometh my salvation.  
2 He only is my rock and my salvation: He is my high tower; I shall not be greatly moved.  
3 How long will ye set upon a man, That ye may slay him, all of you, Like a leaning wall, like a tottering fence?  
4 They only consult to thrust him down from his dignity; They delight in lies; They bless with their mouth, but they curse inwardly. [Sē'lāh]  
5 My soul, wait thou in silence for God only; For my expectation is from him.  
6 He only is my rock and my salvation:

# SCRIPTURES FOR PEACE

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## **MATTHEW 11:28**

Come to me, all who are weary and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest.

## **JOHN 16:33**

I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world.

## **JOHN 14:27**

Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.

## **JAMES 1:2-3**

Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance.



# SERMON STARTERS

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## **GENESIS 18:1-15, 21:1-7 | THE BIRTH OF ISAAC**

Abraham and Sarah had everything stacked against them in order to have a son. How do we react in difficult circumstances? We can keep believing and having faith, when everything seems to be stacked against us? How might a refugee relate to the story?

## **GENESIS 21:8-21 | HAGAR AND ISHMAEL ARE SENT AWAY**

What do we do and feel when we cry to God for mercy? What might have it been like for the Israelites singing the song when they were refugees? What might it be like for refugees today?

## **MATTHEW 9:36**

When he saw the crowds, he had compassion on them. When Jesus felt compassion, he felt it personally and deeply. The Greek in the text refers to his stomach, his guts (fun fact: the word spleen is derived from this Greek term). Jesus' compassion was not simply intellectual – it wasn't sympathy, but deeply felt empathy. How would we respond to the refugee crisis differently if we thought of compassion in the same way as Jesus?

## **MATTHEW 10: 9-10**

When the disciples were present, they relied on people's hospitality. They would not have been able to do their work without hospitality from others. What is the cost of offering hospitality to refugees, and are we prepared to offer this?



# PRAYERS

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## FOR THE GLOBALLY UPROOTED

**PERU:** God our promise land; Christ, our way, Our journey has become long and hard Because we wander about like nomads Not knowing where to go. We are strangers in our own land, without bread, a roof, a future But you came to find us with your life-giving bread. You, who are also displaced, have become an exile with us. You offer us anew the promised land. Your spirit urges us toward that joyous homecoming.

**NEW ZEALAND:** Lord, clear my eyes that I may see the suffering of the refugee. Unstop my ears that I may hear the cries of those in despair. Release my unfettered feet to tread paths where I may some comfort spread... Lord, fill my heart that I might be your servant to the refugee

**CENTRAL AFRICA:** Jesus, you lived in exile in Egypt: Be with all migrant workers and protect their families.

## PRAYERS OF INTERCESSION

God of compassion, you hear the cries of all people. In your kindness, watch over refugees and victims of war, those who have lost family members, families who have been left homeless, and children who have lost the joy of simply being kids. Lord God, comfort all those who suffer. Console all those who mourn. May the hearts of warring people be turned towards peace. May they seek reconciliation with their enemies, and a future built on justice. Amen.



# PRAYERS CONTINUED

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Wise and compassionate God, help us to be willing to respond to the needs of refugees and asylum-seekers, not to see them as burdens, and shift our care unto others. Help our leaders act with generosity and compassion. We pray for people living in fear of displacement and for those who are displaced currently, facing an uncertain future. We ask that they know your love, and presence, and are filled with your peace. Open our eyes, that we may see injustice; open our ears that we may hear a stranger's cry. Open our mouths that we may speak words of welcome. Bless the work of our hands so that together we may act. Amen.

## GRACE BEFORE A MEAL

Bless us, oh Lord, as we join together and remember refugees suffering around the world. We thank you for all that you provide for us. For the food that we can eat, when others are starving. For the water we can drink when others are thirsty. For our friends and family, when others are alone. We pray for those who have fled their homes, who are still in search of safety. May our hearts be filled with compassion; may we act to help bring about your peace. Watch over these people and bring them your comfort, oh Lord. Amen

## PRAYER AFTER A MEAL

Living God, thank you for the food and time we have shared, and for the glimpses into the lives of refugees around the world. Stir in us, give us the courage to act, to combat injustice in all its forms and to commit to helping refugees around the world. Remember the people serving refugees, who worked tirelessly to provide food, medicine and other resources. May their work demonstrate your care. Lord God, give courage to refugees wherever they are around the world. Give them hope as they seek freedom from oppression, give them strength as they seek to survive, may they find true refuge. Amen

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## PRAYER BEFORE A SPECIAL COLLECTION

Loving God, we know we have the means to give, and we know there are people seeking refuge around the world, who need our love and support. God of grace, stir within us. From the greed and injustice that divides the world into rich

From being quick to blame and slow to respond, oh Lord,

From the desire for revenge that adds to the cycle of violence,  
oh Lord, deliver us.

For those who bring healing and peace, Lord hear our prayer.

For those who respond in crisis, Lord hear our prayer.

For wisdom to choose paths of peace, Lord hear our prayer.

For leaders trying to forgive, Lord hear our prayer.

For solidarity with those experiencing loss or hunger, Lord  
hear our prayer.

For generosity to share fairly the world's resources, Lord hear  
our prayer.

For steadfast disciples, responding generously, to the needs of  
suffering people, Lord hear our prayer.

For mothers and children who are traumatized from witnessing  
acts of violence, Lord hear our prayer.

For families who have lost all they own and who want to return

For aid agencies and workers, Lord hear our prayer.

# PRAYER POINTS

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- Pray for more than 84 million people worldwide who have been displaced. Pray for the family struggling to get enough to eat, who have no possessions and are trying to survive in a strange country.
- Pray for peace in the region and for safety and security for all.
- Ask for God's blessing on our interfaith partners distributing much needed food, medical supplies and training.
- Pray for traumatized children whose education has been disrupted by war and from fleeing their homeland.
- Pray for the churches and communities of faith in the region.
- Pray for the leaders and members, that they can bring about reconciliation in their community.

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## CALL TO WORSHIP ADAPTED FROM WORLD COUNCIL OF CHURCHES WORSHIP RESOURCES

L: God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble.

P: Be with those who must flee the injustice of others.

L: Lord Jesus, who had to flee Herod and had nowhere to lay your head.

P: Be with those who have no land to call their own. Our hospitality both reflects and participates in God's hospitality

L: For the refugees from Myanmar, Iraq, Afghanistan and Ukraine.

P: Lord, hear our prayer.

L: For people uprooted in Sudan, Democratic Republic of Congo, and Liberia.

P: Lord, hear our prayer.

L: For refugees and displaced persons who have fled from or are still living in Bosnia and Kosovo.

P: Lord, hear our prayer.

L: For all refugees who have fled oppression in their own countries and are seeking new lives in new lands.

P: Lord, hear our prayer.

All: Help us, Lord, who are the privileged inn-keepers of our day, to find room for those who have been driven from their homelands because of political, racial, or religious reasons. Amen.

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# REFLECTIONS : WINDS OF CHANGE

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## A REFUGEE EDUCATION SIMULATION (15 MINUTES)

This activity explores the emotional consequences of becoming a refugee.

### LEADING THE ACTIVITY

Ask participants to list the five things they value most. The list can include people, material items such as a home, health, etc. If time is limited, this exercise can be done mentally, but it is more effective to make a tangible list. Invite them to share some of the items they've listed.

Now, ask them if they had to give one of those things up, what would it be? Cross it off the list. If they had to give up something else, what would it be? Cross that off the list. Repeat the question/action one more time.

Ask them to share what they eliminated. How did it feel to do that? If time allows, ask when they have had to give up something precious in their lives. Where did they find support in that process?

### REFLECTION

*You can either read this or paraphrase:* As human beings sharing this world, we all seek our own ways of creating a secure environment. Due to circumstances beyond our control, some of us find ourselves facing situations that we could never have imagined. This is especially true for the Afghan families who have been uprooted from their homes because of war and persecution. All are struggling to make a new life in an unfamiliar place. All have had to give up much of what is most precious to them simply to survive. It can be hard for those of us accustomed to our peaceful lives to imagine what it must be like to be a refugee. And yet as the UN High Commission on Refugees said, "Refugees are just like you and me, except they have nothing." What would it be like to be a refugee?
