Kentucky Refugee Ministries (KRM) makes Kentucky home for refugees and immigrants. As a nonprofit refugee resettlement agency, KRM Lexington has been serving refugees and other forcibly displaced people in central Kentucky since 1998. Services include: welcoming and initial resettlement supports; empowering newcomers to become self-sufficient through programs such as employment and ESL; and supporting integration efforts through immigration legal services, citizenship classes, and long-term engagement in the community. Clients may be eligible for services for up to five years after arrival in the United States. Examples of KRM Lexington service areas include case management, employment services, English and cultural orientation classes, youth services, health and mental health navigation, and support for victims of torture and other crimes. KRM Lexington offers a variety of ways for individuals, families, businesses, and faith communities to welcome our newest neighbors.
