Kentucky Refugee Ministries (KRM) makes Kentucky home for refugees. As a nonprofit refugee resettlement agency, KRM began serving refugees and other immigrants in Louisville, KY, in 1990, and opened an office in Northern Kentucky in 2021. Services include: welcoming and initial resettlement supports; empowering newcomers to become self-sufficient through programs such as employment and ELT, and supporting integration efforts through immigration legal services, citizenship, and long-term engagement in the community. Some examples within the array of KRM service areas include case management, employment services, educational and cultural orientation offerings, youth services, and health and mental health navigation.

KRM offers a variety of ways for individuals, families, businesses, and faith communities to welcome our newest neighbors.
