


Site Overview

Home Study and Post Release Services

Promote the safety and well-being of Unaccompanied Children, identify if the placement appears to be safe for reunification with the sponsor, and connect the child and sponsor to needed educational, health, legal, and other community resources. Caseworkers work with children and sponsors to create a plan for self-sufficiency.
