Programs and Services

Reception and Placement Program (R&P)

Initial case management and cash assistance support for refugee families for the first 90 days upon arrival in the US. Case managers support clients in the provision of safe housing and home supplies, work authorization and social security documents, school enrollment, medical screenings, medical insurance, and referral to additional cash assistance, English language training, and employment services.

Refugee Cash Assistance (RCA)

Provides cash assistance for 6-12 months to support ORR eligible populations (refugees, asylees, Ukrainians, Afghans, Cuban Haitian Entrants, victims of severe forms of trafficking, and Special Immigrant Visa holders) while they work towards economic self-sufficiency.

Matching Grant (MG)

Provides case management and employment services including a tailored service plan to ORR eligible populations working to reach economic self-sufficiency.

Employment (EMP)

Supports ORR eligible populations to gaining sustainable employment in order to reach economic self-sufficiency through case management and a tailored service plan.

Refugee Medical Assistance (RMA)

Connects ORR eligible populations with the appropriate medical insurance.

Social Adjustment Services (SAS)

Provides additional regular case management to support client to attain self-sufficiency.

Preferred Communities (PC)

Provides additional intensive case management to support vulnerable clients to attain self-sufficiency.

Home Study and Post Release Services (HSPRS)

Promotes the safety and well-being of unaccompanied children. Case managers work with children to reach goals and connect the child and sponsor to community resources.

Immigration and Legal Services (ILS)

Serves Afghan clients to maintain their work authorization in the US and support them on the path to US citizenship.
