Ukrainian Humanitarian Parolees (UHPs) Arriving after September 30, 2023

Key Information



Ineligibility for UHPs Arriving After Sept 30

As of October 1, 2023, newly arriving UHPs, other than certain eligible derivatives, will not be eligible to receive ORR benefits and services, AUSAA-funded benefits and services such as those provided through Preferred Communities, as well as other mainstream benefits such as Medicaid, TANF and SNAP.

Eligible Derivatives Arriving After Sept 30

A spouse, child, parent, legal guardian or caregiver of a UHP (who arrived between February 24, 2022, and September 30, 2023) and who is paroled into the U.S. after September 30, 2023, may still be eligible for resettlement assistance, ORR benefits and services, and mainstream benefits (see below).





Documentation for Eligible Derivatives

Agencies can confirm eligibility based on derivative relationships listed in the <u>PL 22-13</u> via marriage certificates (for spouses) and birth certificates (for parent, legal guardians and caregivers). Employment Authorization for ORR Ineligible UHPs

UHPs arriving after September 30, 2023 are still work authorized incident to parole status and also exempt from the fee to file Form I-765, Application for Employment Authorization, for initial EADs.
