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FUNDRAISING TIPS

The funds you raise will supply families with food, clean water, safe homes access to education and more!

Create your Facebook Fundraiser

Facebook Fundraisers are an easy way to reach more people and raise more money. You can create and manage your Facebook Fundraiser through your online giving page at <u>fundraise.cwsglobal.org</u>.

Make a personal ask

General posts on social media work, but personal asks go a long way! Use whatever communication method you think your friends will respond to best text, email, or a direct message on social media.

Share your story

Your personal message and reason why you're raising funds for CWS is so important for inspiring compassion from others. Record yourself and post to social media, your story, go live, or ask someone in person.

Share tangible examples of impact

People love being given the opportunity to give, but also want to know HOW they're helping - so give them some numbers – or better yet tell a story of change (<u>cwsglobal.org/stories</u>)!

Be creative

Host a raffle (every \$10 donation gets entered), chalk your neighborhood sidewalks, make a sign to hang at your work desk (we recommend using a QR code to link to your donation page), contact a local restaurant/brewery to host a dine-in/fundraising happy hour event - your options are endless and only limited by what you can come up with!







BIRTHDAY/ANNIVERSARY/MILESTONE DAY

Fundraising Objective:

Use your upcoming birthday, anniversary or any significant milestone day to help you raise critical funds for our most vulnerable neighbors.

Fundraising Ideas:

- 1. Solution You get you add a candle to a cake and when your DIY fundraiser closes or reaches its goal post a before/after picture/video of all the candles.
- 2. Relate various CWS projects to experiences you've had throughout life. For example, share a story through your DIY/social media about how excited you used to be about getting a new toy (share favorite toy) and how through your CWS fundraiser you can provide that same feeling for a refugee child. (See Price Points page for suggestions of CWS program prices).
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- 4. When you're halfway to your goal, share your most embarrassing birthday/anniversary (wedding/honeymoon) story on your DIY/social media pages. Let people know ahead of time if this will help motivate giving.
- 5. 1 For those that are motivated by physical activity: Walk/Run a mile for every donation you get on your birthday or do push-ups for the donation total. (\$20 for 20 push-ups).

Price Points/Make Your Ask:

Request donations based on your age (\$65 for 65 for example) or use your birth year for a lower/different price point. For example, 65 years old would be \$19.60 since you'd have been born in 1960. For anniversaries you could do the number of years you have been married or how old you were when you got married. Be creative, have fun, but no matter what make your ask!







IMMIGRATION/REFUGEE FOCUS

Fundraising Objective:

Put your passion for the global and local immigrant and refugee community into action and raise critical funds for our displaced neighbors.

Challenge Fundraisers

- 1. A Walk/Bike/Run for Refugees Commit to walking, biking, or running a set number of miles over a week to represent the long journeys refugees make to find safety. Get sponsors to pledge per mile.
- 2. Ration Challenge Eat only a small selection of staple foods (like rice, lentils, and flour) for a week to raise awareness about the limited food rations refugees receive in camps. Ask for donations in support of CWS's refugee programs.
- 3. Water Carry Challenge Carry a gallon of water with you for a day (or longer!) to symbolize the long distances refugees travel to fetch clean water. Get sponsors to donate per hour or mile carried.
- 4. Winimalist Week Live with only the bare essentials for a week—one bag of clothes, minimal food, and limited internet/technology—to reflect the experience of displaced families starting over. Ask for donations and share reflections daily.

Community & Event Fundraisers

- 1. Film Screening & Discussion Host a movie night featuring a documentary or film about refugees, with a Q&A or discussion afterward. Charge admission or collect donations.
- 2. Solution 2. Cook a meal inspired by different refugee cultures and invite guests to learn about CWS's work while donating.
- 3. Refugee Artisan Sale Sell handmade crafts, art, or baked goods inspired by refugee communities.
- 4. A Refugee Experience Set up an immersive event where participants walk through different stations representing challenges refugees face, such as food rationing, water scarcity, or the resettlement process. Charge a donation for entry.

Social Media & Virtual Fundraisers

- 1. 📢 #WalkInTheirShoes Social Challenge Share stories of refugee journeys and challenge friends to walk 5, 10, or 20 miles to raise funds and awareness.
- 2. Den Mic for Hope Host a poetry or storytelling night, with proceeds supporting CWS's refugee assistance programs.





VALENTINE'S DAY (FEB 14)/LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR

Fundraising Objective:

Use Valentine's Day or the general theme of loving our neighbor to raise life-saving funds for our most vulnerable neighbors.

Acts of Love Challenges

- 1. Love Your Neighbor Challenge 🎔 Commit to an act of kindness every day leading up to Valentine's Day (e.g., writing notes to refugees, volunteering, or donating). Ask friends and family to sponsor your kindness campaign with donations to CWS.
- 2. Heart for Refugees Campaign 💙 Sell or gift paper hearts with messages of welcome and hope to raise funds for CWS's refugee support programs.
- 3. Skip the Sweets, Give the Love � → ♥ Challenge yourself to give up chocolates or treats for a week and donate what you would have spent to support families rebuilding their lives.

Valentine's-Themed Events

- 1. Cupid's Charity Dinner 📶 Host a simple dinner with a global menu and share stories of how CWS helps communities worldwide. Charge an entry fee or ask for donations.
- 2. Share the Love Bake Sale 🎲 Sell heart-shaped cookies, international sweets, or fairtrade chocolates, donating the proceeds to CWS programs.
- 3. Love Across Borders Card Drive M Organize a card-making event where participants create welcome cards for newly arrived refugees. Charge a small donation to join, and send the cards through a local resettlement office.

Social Media & Virtual Fundraisers

- 1. Heart-to-Heart Matching Challenge 💞 Encourage a donor (or yourself!) to match Valentine's Day donations up to a set amount. Share love-themed stories of CWS's impact throughout the campaign.
- 2. Hug for Hope Challenge 읋 Pledge to give a hug (or a virtual hug) for every donation received, sharing messages about how CWS embraces those in need worldwide.
- 3. Love in Every Language S Post translations of "love" and "welcome" in different languages, sharing how CWS supports refugees from diverse backgrounds. Ask for donations tied to each post.





WORLD WATER DAY (MARCH 22)

Fundraising Objective:

Do you care about access to clean water for all of our global neighbors as well as Water, Sanitation and Hygiene [WASH] work for neighbors who need it? Then use World Water Day on March 22 as your fundraising focus!

Challenge Fundraisers

- 1. Skip the Shower Challenge A Participants commit to skipping their shower for a day (or longer) and donate what they would have spent on water and utilities. They can also ask sponsors to donate per day skipped.
- 2. H2O Fast 🍐 Go a day drinking only water (no coffee, soda, or juice) and donate what you would have spent on beverages.
- 3. Walk for Water 🤾 Walk a set distance carrying a jerry can or bucket of water, simulating the journey many make to fetch water daily. Collect pledges for every mile walked.
- 4. Bucket Bath Challenge Use only a small bucket of water for all hygiene needs for a day, week or set amount of time and encourage donations.
- 5. Toilet Paper Ban 🖳 Go a day using alternatives to toilet paper, highlighting sanitation struggles in communities without access to clean water.

Activity Fundraisers

- 1. Lap-a-Thon A Swim laps at a local pool and get pledges per lap to support CWS's water access projects.
- 2. Water Balloon Battle 📍 Organize a water balloon fight with an entry fee, educating participants on global water challenges before playing.
- 3. DIY Water Filter Workshop **S** Host a session teaching how water filters work, charging a small participation fee.
- 4.Blue Day at School or Work – Encourage people to wear blue and donate to raise awareness about water scarcity.

Community & Social Media Campaigns

- 1. One Gallon for One Day Challenge 🚰 Live on just one gallon of water for a day and document the experience on social media, asking for donations.
- 2. Dine & Donate: Water Edition 🐩 Host a dinner where only water is served as a drink, with a focus on how clean water access changes lives.
